





Curriculum Letter

You will get sent a curriculum letter on the website. This included our topic letter, entry and exit points and any trips or notable dates happening that half term.



Computing This half term we will explore how to be safe and effective learners in the digital world. We will learn how to use search engines safely and how to use images, audio and text to communicate information.	Maths We will be learning all about number and exploring place value, addition and subtraction up to 10. We will be using part whole models and ten frames to show different ways of representing number and number lines to explore how quantities increase and decrease.	IPC Science/PSHE – Brainwaves This half term we will be learning about our brain and how it helps us to learn. We will explore how we can affect the quality of our own learning, some of the recent evidence and research into the brain and learning and apply these theories to our own learning and reflect on their importance.
RE In RE we will be focusing on the religion Christianity. We will begin to identify what Christians believe about God and about Jesus as the Son of God. This unit looks at stories about Jesus and stories that Jesus told and students will identify different symbols of Christianity.	Our topics this half term are: Brainwaves and Learning Safely Online. This is the learning that will be taking place in Year 1 this half term. If you have any questions, please speak to the Red Hill Year 1 team!	
PE We are focusing on Dance and Multiskills this half term. We will be practicing throwing and catching, functional movement and how to sequence steps into a dance routine. We will also learn about warming up before exercise.		English Our key texts this half term are Beegu by Alexis Deacon and Where the Wild Things Are by Maurice Sendak. We will start the year by practicing speaking in full sentences and move onto writing them down using a space between each word. We will learn about the skills prediction and inference while reading Beegu and how to summarise and describe with Where the Wild Things Are. We will also learn the difference between an author and an illustrator. We will explore poetry and also write a setting description.
Phonics We will be recapping our knowledge of Phase 2 and Phase 3 sounds and also learning how to read longer Phase 4 words with these sounds in them as well. We will be working hard on saying a sentence and using our sounds to write it down, across the curriculum.		Music This half term we will join our Key Stage 1 peers in singing assembly. We will explore rhythm and recall and begin to learn words, pitch and actions to popular and new songs.
