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In Year 6, our topic is Existing, Endangered and Extinct. For our entry point we created the biomes of endangered animals based on research we carried out.



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


In Year 5 our new IPC topic is Space Scientists and we have been studying the moon, sun and their relevance. We were looking at the moon and how it relates to low and high tides and why these are important. The children created comic stories of the importance of the low and high tides as part of their learning.






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Year 4 went to the British Museum for our IPC topic- temples, tombs and treasures. We were able to explore pharaohs that had been through the mummification process as well as the significance of the symbols and patterns on the sarcophagus coffins.

We became embalmers and carried out the process of mummification. We even wrapped the body and put it inside a sarcophagus. We also used clay to make the sacred scarab beetle of Ancient Egyptian times.



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


In Year 3, we have loved learning about the human body in Science this half term. We explored the steps of digestion by taking part in the digestive system experiment.



Through this experiment we were able to gain a deeper understanding of the steps of digestion, the organ functions, how vitamins and minerals leave the food and enter the bloodstream and how good and bad digestion affects the end-product! It was fascinating!

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For our entry point in **Year 2**, for the topic 'From A to B', we arrived at school dressed for a holiday, suitcases in hand. We created our own passports and boarded a Red Hill airlines flight in the classroom. During the journey, we explored different types of transport, what we need to use them-like tickets and boarding passes-and where they can take us.

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Year 1 had a wonderful swash buckling time being pirates for our entry point to our new topic 'Treasure Island'. We dressed up in pirate costumes, learnt to sing a sea shanty, played pirate games and even walked the plank. The whole year group are super excited to learn all about our new topic and how pirates sailed the seven seas.

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

Important Safeguarding Notice: Children's "Spy" Books

We want to make you aware of a recent issue affecting some popular children's books by Andrew Cope, including the Spy Dogs, Spy Cats, and Spy Pups series.

Some editions of these books include a printed web address at the back. This link used to go to the author's website, but the domain is no longer under his control. It has since been taken over by another party and now leads to inappropriate adult content.

The publisher, Puffin, has paused sales and distribution of the books and is working with schools, libraries, and retailers to remove copies from circulation. They have stressed that the website has no connection to the author or publisher.

If your child has any Spy Dog, Spy Cat or Spy Pups books at home, please check the back for website links and make sure they do not try to visit the site.

It is safe for children to continue reading the stories themselves — the concern is only with the outdated link.

We recommend talking with your child about the importance of not following web addresses in books without checking with an adult first.

Please can we remind parents to park considerately along the main road but also in neighbouring carparks.
